



## Researching C of O's History for PED 101

Start by asking some basic questions such as:

- What is my topic?
- Who are my group members?
- When and where will we meet?
- How will we share in the work?
- What will our final project look like?

Begin researching your topic. Your research might be done by:

- Interviews
- Library research
- Field trips on campus
- Reading the Flight of the Phoenix
- Any other method that works for you

Not all topics are easily researched in the library. However, it is a good place to start as we have a special collection of materials about the school. It's called the Ozarkiana room. Here you will find:

- Yearbooks
- Campus newspapers and other publications
- Photographs
- Newspaper and magazine articles about the school
- Research materials collected by the authors of Flight of the Phoenix

When you begin your library research, ask a librarian for pointers. We may find something for you here or suggest other places on campus that may be helpful. Take advantage of our experience!

While in the library, keep these things in mind:

- Group meetings can get noisy. To provide the best atmosphere for all our library users, we may ask you to be quieter or move to a more secluded location in the library.
- Materials in the Ozarkiana room are unique, fragile, and irreplaceable. Please use them gently. A library worker will remain with you to provide help and ensure the safety of the collection.
- Items from the Ozarkiana room cannot be checked out; however, photocopiers are available for a small fee.
- Food, drinks, candy, gum, and tobacco are not allowed in the Ozarkiana room as these things can damage documents.
